




Commitment Types*




Dual Commitments**

*Youth can have multiple commitments at the same time. Commitment Type data represents all commitments held by youth under DJC's care.




Administrative Confinement Placements



As of June 2023, youth pending transfer are not included in the average Administrative Confinement duration.




